1. Parish Buildings - Asset Audit

Following on from the presentation by James Zehnder, Property Services at the latest parish viability meetings, the diocese has engaged AssetFuture to undertake a Parish Buildings Asset Audit. The outcome of this engagement is that the diocese will be able to generate asset plans to include:

- 1. Current asset registers
- 2. Current backlog/maintenance liability
- 3. A ten-year capital maintenance plan

This project will give Parishes access to an invaluable source of information in relation to the current state of your buildings and assist you with developing future maintenance schedules. This data would enable you to make informed decisions about the future works that may need to be undertaken, and enable you, where necessary, to assess the viability of particular buildings and infrastructure.

Nichola and Mary-Anne will be assisting the team as AssetFuture to coordinate access to buildings by contacting all parishes within the next two weeks to arrange dates and times for assessors to gain access to all parish owned properties, which will also include rental properties.
